MARCH PROGRAM

Coal Combustion Residue (CCR) management program

Mr. Jerry Strauss, P.E., PMP will speak about the controversial Coal Combustion Residue (CCR) management program being undertaken by U.S. EPA. It's controversial because the coal and cement industry have indicated that management of CCR as a hazardous waste will lead to dropping the use of coal ash in cement and roadbed construction and an acceleration of coal-fired power plant retirements. On the other hand, the environmental community claims current CCR management practices lead to groundwater contamination by toxic metals. The part of the EPA program he will speak about focuses on the assessment of dams and dikes that contain the ash wastes.



Mr. Strauss has 38 years of environmental engineering experience, including over 20 years addressing coal wastes and/or RCRA compliance. He has managed major contracts in support of U.S. EPA totaling over \$60M. He is currently Vice President, Environmental Services, at Dewberry. He is a Professional Engineer and a certified Project Management Professional. He earned his Master's degree in Environmental Engineering from UMass and a Bachelors Degree in Chemical Engineering from Tufts University.
