Dam and Levee Breach and Inundation-Mapping and Consequences

Scott Perkins and Jeff Albee

A concise presentation on bringing the disciplines of H&H Engineering, Surveying and GIS together for Dam & Levee related projects for both State & Federal programs, including the USACE's program for MMC – modeling, mapping & consequences; USDA-NRCS statewide dam breach inundation program in Kansas. Discussion Items include:

- Determination of consequences by identifying at-risk structures and for the identification of potential mitigation projects to reduce consequences to life and property.
- Identifying the potentially hazardous areas in communities, formulation of plans and control development in those areas to reduce consequences on life and property from future dam failures.
- Tools used include ESRI ArcGIS & PLTS to perform cartography services and completing Engineering analysis to develop breach inundation maps using hydrology (HEC-HMS), reservoir routing, breach hydrograph development (TR-60 & TR-66) and unsteady flow HEC-RAS modeling and ESRI HEC-GeoRAS


