

Dr. Todd Stewart

Director of International and Homeland Security, the Ohio State University

Dr. Todd Stewart was appointed to the position of Director, Program for International and Homeland Security, The Ohio State University, in April 2002. In this capacity, he is responsible for promoting research and study into the national security challenges facing Ohio and the nation. His responsibilities include identifying and responding to the research, technology, education, training and support requirements for federal, state and community governmental agencies responsible for national security, as well as collaborating with various research foundations and private- sector organizations involved with these problems and issues. He also serves as the Executive Director of the National Academic Consortium for Homeland Security.

In September 2006, the United States Senate confirmed President George W. Bush's nomination of Dr. Stewart to serve a four year appointment as a member of the National Security Education Board. This group directs the National Security Education Program, establish in law in 1991 to promote national security, through the study of international issues and languages.

Prior to his current appointment at The Ohio State University, he served for 34 years with the United States Air Force. His military career included numerous command and staff assignments in positions responsible for strategic planning and installation management, including infrastructure construction, operation and maintenance, and environmental protection in the United States, Germany and Greenland. While on active duty, he also served as an Associate Professor of Management at the Air Force Institute of Technology. He retired from active service in April 2002, in the grade of major general.

General Stewart's academic education includes a bachelor of science degree in civil engineering from Michigan Technological University, a master of science degree in engineering administration from Southern Methodist University, and a doctor of philosophy degree in management from the University of Nebraska. He is also a graduate of the Air Force Squadron Officer School, the Air Command and Staff College, and the Air War College.

He is a member of the Academy of Management, Michigan Technological University's Academy of Civil and Environmental Engineers, the Society of American Military Engineers and the Air Force Association.
